Day 1 / Monday, 25 May 2026

Baku

Salam eleykim! Welcome to Azerbaijan. On arrival at Baku Airport, you'll be met by a representative and transferred to your hotel. Baku certainly is a city where old meets new – ancient fortified buildings standing next to Russian imperial-style squares and ultra-modern architectural wonders. Your adventure begins with a welcome meeting at 6 pm in the evening, where you will meet your local leader and fellow travellers joining you for this adventure. If you arrive with time to spare, perhaps take a walk down the charming Nizami Street and observe its Baroque, Neo-Gothic and Neo-Renaissance architecture. After your meeting, enjoy a local dinner with your leader and small group. In Azerbaijan, sharing bread is thought to seal a bond of friendship, so perhaps break some bread with your travel companions.

Day 2 / Tuesday, 26 May 2026

Baku/Absheron

This morning, embark on a tour of the city with a local guide. Pay a visit to the fortified Old City, once the Medieval capital, where your guide will weave together the history of Baku, from the rule of the Shirvanshahs to the cosmopolitan city you see today. Stop by the Shemakha Gate, Maiden Tower (visit optional), Old Market Square and end with a guided tour of the Palace of the Shirvanshahs. Be sure to bring your camera as there will be some panoramic views of Baku's varied skyline to enjoy. Afterwards, head out of the city on a day trip to the Absheron Peninsula. Visit the Ateshgah Fire Temple and the eternally burning Yanar Dag (Fire Mountain).

Baku/Qobustan

This morning, drive to Qobustan – also known as Gobustan National Park – a UNESCO World Heritage site that's famous for its ancient rock carvings and mud volcanoes. Stop on the way to check out these geological formations as they spew mud and gas. The rock carvings in Qobustan date back to the Stone Age, giving humans today an insight into daily life all those years ago. With over 6000 petroglyphs on display, Qobustan is often referred to as one of the largest open-air museums in the world. Return to Baku in the afternoon and visit Carpet museum, which is located in the fascinating building shaped as rolled carpet. Enjoy a free evening to explore the city at your own pace. Perhaps visit one of Baku's most significant modern landmarks, the Heydar Aliyev Center designed by Zaha Hadid. This evening you may like to take a walk along the waterfront to find a restaurant for dinner, keeping an eye out for the Baku Eye and Flame Towers that light up the city skyline at night

Shamakhi / Sheki

Leave Baku and head for the Caucasus Mountains in the northwest of Azerbaijan. Watch arid landscapes slowly give way to densely forested mountains. En route to Sheki, there will be stops at Juma Mosque in Shamakhi and at Yeddi Gumbaz Mausoleum. On arrival in Sheki, visit a local craft workshop where the famous shebeke – stained-glass windows with intricately carved frames – are made by hand. You will also visit the acclaimed Palace of Shaki Khans to see its magnificent frescoes and stained glass. Arrive in Sheki and enjoy a final evening of Azerbaijani cuisine during an included dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 5 / Friday, 29 May 2026**Signakhi/Gremi/Artana (Kakheti region)**

Enjoy breakfast at the hotel and visit Sheki Khan's Palace to see its magnificent frescoes and stained glass before driving to Lagodekhi – a town at the Azerbaijan–Georgia border – where you will change transportation. From here, travel to the beautiful 18th-century town of Signaghi, known for its quaint stone walls, small houses with terracotta roofs and decorated balconies. Here you will meet with an expert local guide who will explain the history of the intriguing town. After some time to admire the picturesque views of Alazani Valley and drive to Telavi. In the evening pay a visit to a local family winery and have a wonderful dinner with the family, which includes delicious homemade cuisine, wine and chacha, a local brandy. There will also be time to listen to unique Georgian polyphonic songs – a traditional style of music prevalent in the Kakheti region.

Enjoy a relaxing start to your morning, and then get a taste of local life during a visit to the Telavi Food Market. Wander the stalls and feast your senses on the region's delicacies – there are specialty cheeses, wines and sweets to try! Leaving behind Kakheti region drive to Georgian capital – Tbilisi. Once arrived perhaps wander the old districts of Georgia's capital, which are structured like terraces, and walk through the narrow streets to appreciate the colorful houses, patterned balconies and revamped modern architecture. Enjoy a free afternoon – your leader will have some wonderful recommendations for local restaurants to head for dinner.

Day 7 / Sunday, 1 June 2026

Tbilisi

Meals Included: Breakfast

This morning uncover the secrets of the city on a walking tour with your local guide, beginning from the Gabriadze Tower, which is one of the iconic sights of Tbilisi. Stroll along the busy streets of the Old Town until you will take a cable car to the ancient Narikala Fortress, a former Persian citadel with a history stretching back to the 4th century. Here your guide will share the layered history of the fortress while you take in sweeping views across Tbilisi. Then make your way to a historic part of the city where you will learn a little more about Tbilisi's past. The name Tbilisi translates to 'warm place' which is thought to be after the bubbling hot springs that the city was built around. This afternoon you may like to visit one of the local bathhouses for a dip in the therapeutic waters, or perhaps visit the stunning treasury of the Golden Fund at the Natural History Museum, where you'll learn why Georgia is called the land of the Golden Fleece.

Mtskheta / Tserovani / Kutaisi

Meals Included: Breakfast / Lunch

Today meet with a local guide for a visit to Mtskheta, the ancient capital and religious center of Georgia. Visit World Heritage-listed sites with your local guide on hand to share their fascinating histories, such as the 11th-century Svetitskhoveli Monastery. Afterwards, pay a visit to the Tserovani Refugee Settlement, home to 8000 people displaced by the 2008 conflict between the Russian Federation and the Republic of Georgia over South Ossetia. While here you will visit an enamel jewelry workshop – a social enterprise offering training and employment to displaced youth and women within the camp. You will have the chance to meet the jewelry artists whose pieces tell the story of Georgia, and with their guidance, you will design a piece yourself. Have a light lunch of Georgian specialties then tour the settlement to learn about the issues surrounding long-term displacement faced by thousands of Georgia's citizens to this day. This inspiring experience sheds light on a side of the country that few visitors get to see, and is sure to be one of your lasting memories of your time in Georgia. Continue to Uplistsikhe Cave Town (1st millennium BC) where the Great Silk Road used to pass. Here you will see dwelling quarters, wine cellars, bakeries, a three-nave basilica church hewn out into the rock. Drive to Kutaisi, which believed to be the destination of Jason and Argonauts sought Golden Fleece thousands years ago.

You have also included visit to the Enguri Dam what offers a breathtaking view of one of the world's highest concrete arch dams amidst the stunning Caucasus Mountains. In the evening enjoy dinner and overnight at a family hotel in Becho.

From there, we head along the river, through the beautiful meadows of Guli Valley to the ruins of the abandoned Gul Village with a unique small church where women are not allowed to enter. The hike ends at a summer farm with spectacular views of southern and northern Ushba. Upon returning home, pleasantly tired, we will be treated to the most delectable Svanetian dinner at our family run guesthouse in Mestia.

After an uphill (1870m), descend to the beautiful valley full of flowers and with a view of Chalaadi glacier (2300 m) and Mestia Valley's watchtowers. After returning to Mestia, visit the Historical Ethnographic museum. In the evening, discover how Georgians make their beloved cheese. Cheese is found in many Georgian dishes and is a key ingredient in the famous khachapuri, a traditional Georgian dish of cheese-filled bread which you will no doubt eat plenty of during your time here!

Today, visit the village of Ushguli, which was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. The village is located at 2200m and is the highest continuously inhabited village in Europe. The village is most famous for its abundance of watchtowers and this is where you get the view of the highest mountain in Georgia – Mt. Shkhara (5068m). Visit Lamaria church (12th century) and walk to Queen Tamar's tower (2300m). In the evening, walk around the village and get familiar with the daily life of the local people.

Day 13 / Saturday, 7 June 2026

Ushguli / Shkhara glacier / Mestia

This morning, start the walk straight from the guesthouse, heading toward the base of Georgia's highest mountain - the majestic Shkhara (5,068 m), part of the Greater Caucasus range. The route follows the scenic Enguri valley, leading us through open alpine meadows bursting with colorful wildflowers in season and surrounded by dramatic snow-capped peaks. The trail gradually ascends toward the foot of the Shkhara Glacier, where the mighty Enguri River - lifeline of Svaneti - begins its journey. The glacier's tongue, sitting at around 2,500 meters, offers breathtaking views and a powerful sense of nature's scale and force. After the hike you return to Mestia for another great dinner together.

Day 14 / Sunday, 8 June 2026**Koruldi Lakes / Mestia**

An amazing day is ahead - hike from Mestia to the Chalaadi Glacier. The trail begins with a crossing over a suspension bridge above the Mestiachala River, then winds through a mixed forest before leading to a rocky mountain path. After taking in the views and resting by the glacier, return to Mestia on the same path. The afternoon is free for you to enjoy at your own pace. You might choose to watch Dede - a powerful local film set in the very landscapes you've walked through - or visit one of Mestia's excellent museums, such as the Svaneti History and Ethnography Museum or the Mikheil Khergiani House Museum, dedicated to the legendary Svan alpinist.

Today, travel from the mountains to the sea with a long drive to Batumi (approx. 7 hours), a lively resort city on the Black Sea coast. Once a Soviet-era favorite, Batumi now charms visitors with a blend of modern attractions and historic character. Explore the city with a local guide, strolling along the famous Batumi Boulevard with its parks, fountains, beach bars, and iconic sights such as the Ferris wheel, Alphabet Tower, and the moving sculpture of Ali & Nino. You'll also visit Europe Square, featuring the Astronomical Clock and Medea statue, as well as the elegant Piazza Square, known for its mosaics, stained glass, and vibrant ambiance.

The trail includes uphill and downhill sections - a bit more challenging than a typical walk in the park. Adventurous souls can take a dip in the cold, refreshing water. After soaking in nature and building up some good fatigue, return to Batumi. The evening is free - a perfect time to enjoy the sunset at a seaside restaurant.

Enjoy a final breakfast in Tbilisi before setting off toward Sadakhlo, a village on the Georgia-Armenia border. After completing border formalities, continue your journey into Armenia and begin the next chapter of your adventure. Your first stop is the magnificent Haghpat Monastery, a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site and one of the finest examples of medieval Armenian architecture. Surrounded by lush green hills, Haghpat offers a peaceful atmosphere and a perfect introduction to Armenia's rich history and spiritual heritage - your tour leader will provide insights into the country's culture, religion, and architectural traditions. From there, travel to the picturesque resort town of Dilijan, famous for its forested mountains and fresh air. Enjoy a walk through the old town and visit charming Sharambeyan Street, where traditional Armenian houses host various craft shops featuring handmade ceramics, woodwork, textiles, and more.

It's a great place for a picnic. Return to Dilijan for a free evening.

After breakfast, explore another part of Dilijan National Park. The trail begins at Parz Lich (Clear Lake), a small, picturesque lake nestled in Dilijan highlands. From here, trek through lush, dense woodlands, suddenly emerging in a vast grassy meadow and return to Dilijan. Then drive to the reflective waters of Lake Sevan, nicknamed 'The Pearl of Armenia'. Sevan is one of the largest fresh-water high-altitude lakes in the world. Visit Sevanavank Monastery, which overlooks the water on the Peninsula. In the afternoon, drive to Armenia's capital, Yerevan, where you will spend the next two evenings.

Day 21 / Sunday, 15 June 2026

Yerevan

This morning, your local guide will introduce you to the sights and sounds of Yerevan on a city tour. Founded in 782 BC, Armenia's capital is one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world. Today, its charm lies in the unique blend of ancient heritage and a vibrant, modern lifestyle. In the afternoon, drive to the village of Garni to visit the impressive 1st-century Garni Temple. Here, you'll be treated to a special musical performance inside the temple - featuring the duduk, Armenia's ancient flute-like instrument. Afterward, take a walk to the nearby natural wonder known as the Symphony of Stones - striking vertical basalt columns that resemble a giant organ carved by nature, lining the cliffs of the Azat River gorge. Continue northeast to reach the awe-inspiring Geghard Monastery, a masterpiece of medieval Armenian architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Partially carved into the surrounding cliffs, the complex is both spiritually and visually powerful, offering a memorable end to an enriching day of exploration.

Day 22 / Monday, 16 June 2026**Amberd Fortress / Letter Park / Zvartnots / Yerevan****Meals Included:** Breakfast / Dinner

In the morning, visit the Armenian Genocide Museum to gain a deeper understanding of one of the most tragic chapters in the region's history. Afterwards, drive toward Amberd Fortress, perched dramatically at 2,300 meters above sea level on a high promontory between two rivers, on the southern slopes of Mount Aragats. Enjoy a scenic hike up to the fortress, surrounded by alpine landscapes and panoramic views. On the way back to Yerevan, stop near the village of Oshakan to visit the Armenian Alphabet Park - a tribute to the creator of the Armenian script, Mesrop Mashtots. Set against the backdrop of Mount Aragats, the park features giant stone carvings of all 39 letters of the Armenian alphabet. Back in Yerevan, take time to explore the lively Yerevan Fruit Market, where stalls overflow with fresh local produce, dried fruits, traditional sweets, and colorful spices - a great place to experience everyday life and pick up a few treats. Tonight, gather with your group for a final dinner at a local restaurant. Armenian cuisine is rooted in fresh local ingredients and bold flavors. You might like to try khorovats (barbecued meat skewers), spas (a tangy yogurt soup), or other local specialties as you toast to the journey and new memories.
